Allison: All governments should be responsible for the health care of their citizens. For too long private insurance companies and pharmaceuticals have controlled the amount of services offered the ailing based on the amount of income they earn. Obviously, a health care system that only caters to the rich can hardly be tolerated in a modern democracy. Meanwhile, insurers who pay for medical services have every incentive to avoid payment and curtail costs at every turn. They will seek out every loophole in insurance policies to deny payment and maximize profits. They possess armies of lawyers who will exploit any nuance in an agreement purely for benefit of their employers and in complete disregard for patients.

Paul: Allowing the government to control the health care system is dangerous in many aspects. First, it does not allow the patient the power of choice. Like cows, patients are herded through the health-care system without receiving the personal care they deserve. Second, innovation on the part of the health-care industry might become stagnant as prices are controlled, not by the market, but by a centralized authority. This means lower quality medication and fewer cures to our most troubling diseases. I agree the insurance companies have a stranglehold on the health-care system; however, this fact alone does not justify the radical shift away from the market to government-run medical services. There must be regulation by the government, but it must be done in moderation, not with all-out control.
